**Law School Grad Leads Firm in Collecting Over 6,500 Pounds of Food**

**Alexandria, VA** (May 16, 2009) . . . Jeremy R. Moss, a 2007 graduate of the Columbus School of Law, led MercerTrigiani law firm in placing second among small law firms in Northern Virginia by raising 6,549 pounds of food in the Third Annual Legal Food Frenzy. The Legal Food Frenzy, which ran from March 30 through April 10, is a collaborative project sponsored by the Attorney General's Office, Virginia Bar Association and Federation of Virginia Food Banks.

According to a news release issued by the Office of the Attorney General, 216 law firms across Virginia raised the equivalent of more than 1.6 million pounds of food for the hungry. The statewide competition pitted law firms against each other to help the hungry and beat its goal of 1.5 million pounds.
